GRACE, which stands for Girls Reaching Advancement in Career Education, is a free mentoring initiative and college prep program for young women who are currently high school juniors. Each participant will be paired with a female mentor who works in a career field of interest to the student. GRACE will offer a range of support, including:

- Homework help, academic tutoring and remediation, and SAT and college essay preparation;
 - College advisement and application support;
 - Career exposure activities;
 - Leadership development enrichments; and
 - Community engagement opportunities.
