ABOUT EDUCATIONAL ALLIANCE

Educational Alliance (EA), one of New York City's original settlement houses, was founded in 1889 to offer educational, social, and cultural services to Jewish immigrants arriving to the Lower East Side. Today, EA is a proudly Jewish institution that partners with diverse communities throughout Lower Manhattan. We provide New Yorkers with high-quality, transformational programs that enhance their well-being and socio-economic opportunities, reflecting our belief that everyone in our city should be given the tools to thrive.

Our wide array of programs includes free meals for older adults, addiction treatment and recovery, innovative early childhood education, art classes, Jewish cultural and educational events, and more. We remain committed to recognizing the intrinsic value within each individual and the importance of building community.



MANNY CANTOR CENTER

Manny Cantor Center (MCC) is a community center for all ages and backgrounds, located on the Lower East Side. As the flagship site of Educational Alliance, we seek to bring our constituents together over shared goals for our vibrant neighborhood. Through programs including EC@MCC — our nationally recognized child care and preschool program, historic EA community art school, state-of-the-art fitness center, newly renovated Teen Center, innovative community programs and social services offerings, and dynamic older adult centers, we are committed to empowering people so that they can flourish. At Manny Cantor Center, we are guided by a strength-based model; we recognize the value of community engagement and believe that everyone is called upon — and everyone is able — to contribute substantively to their community.



LEARN MORE ABOUT: OUR CONGREGATE MEAL PROGRAM

For the past few years, the price of food has been steadily increasing, up nearly 25% from 2020-2024. That's an abstraction for most of us, but for many of those on a fixed income, it's a crisis – one that means they can't afford to feed themselves.

In our congregate meal program, we are currently providing daily breakfasts and lunches to about 10,000 older adults each month. Food is simply too expensive for many in our community, so they come to us. We have been a crucial support for the people in our communities for over a century. In this moment of food scarcity, we will continue to do all that we possibly can to feed those who are hungry.

THE 14TH STREET Y

The 14th Street Y (14Y) is a Jewish community center located in Downtown Manhattan.

Each year, tens of thousands of New Yorkers of all ages, races, and ethnicities come to 14Y as members, visitors, or partners to experience our high quality and varied programs centered around arts and culture, early childhood education, afterschool, summer camps, fitness and aquatics, Jewish life, and older adult services.

At 14Y, we are dedicated to building an inclusive hub where Jews and the broader community can come together. As the only major convening space for the Jewish community in Manhattan below 59th street, we provide a variety of opportunities to discover, explore, and connect with Jewish life. We are committed to facilitating thoughtful and innovative conversations, performances, and gallery shows that engage our audiences and celebrate Jewish culture.

Under the banner of Downtown Together, our recently expanded bridge building initiative includes classes, clubs, workshops, and communal gatherings that fill a critically untapped need for a gathering space; activities like pickleball, knitting club, and canasta make people want to connect with one another and create community.

From programs like our avant-garde LABA artistic fellowship, where artists study Jewish texts and develop new works, to Project ORE, which provides enriching wraparound services to vulnerable older New Yorkers, to 14Y Selah, a pluralistic Jewish addiction recovery community, we are committed to finding innovative ways to meet the needs of all our members.



LEARN MORE ABOUT: OUR COMMUNITY BUILDING INITIATIVE

We hear a lot in the press about polarization and division in our society. But here's something you don't often hear: Organizations can make a difference, among them community centers.

In our Downtown Together initiative, we created more than a dozen clubs, from cooking, salsa dancing, and mah jongg to French conversation, playwriting, and "Discussion as a Pathway to Community." We've also seen an increased community-oriented focus in many of our athletics offerings, including pickleball, pick-up basketball, and our punk rope fitness class. Hundreds of New Yorkers from all backgrounds participated, building relationships across the barriers that too often keep us apart.

CENTER FOR RECOVERY AND WELLNESS

At Educational Alliance's Center for Recovery and Wellness (CRW), we are committed to serving whole individuals, whole families, and whole communities. Our dedicated staff take a holistic, strengths-based approach to recovery and wellness that responds to the distinct needs of each individual. Our programs include residential and outpatient addiction treatment, recovery services, prevention education, and community programming such as our free Community Food Program and employment and housing services. Currently, CRW is also working to combat the fentanyl crisis by reaching at-risk individuals and offering innovative drug treatment programs that incorporate music, art, and wellness into the recovery process.

We believe integrated, inclusive approaches that connect individuals with their families and communities lead to more effective interventions and long-term success. We offer culturally competent, evidence-based programs and services that strengthen individuals and communities, enhance resiliency, and foster lasting recovery.



LEARN MORE ABOUT: OUR RECOVERY CLUB

Addiction thrives in isolation. Recovery thrives in community.

On weekends, CRW clients — alongside members of the wider community — gather in a warm, substance-free space to share music, poetry slams, food, games, sports, movies, and conversation. The Clubhouse reflects CRW's belief that recovery cannot happen in isolation. CRW is not simply an addiction treatment program — it is a community center with recovery at its heart. By creating spaces where people are seen, supported, and valued, CRW restores something addiction often takes away: trust, connection, and hope.

COMMUNITY SCHOOLS AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Educational Alliance's Community Schools & Youth Development (CSYD) department plays an integral role in delivering high-quality youth programming throughout the Lower East Side with services embedded in the school day, afterschool programs, and summer enrichment opportunities.

Every year, our afterschool enrichment program serves over a thousand students from kindergarten to eighth grade. Both during the school year and summer (through our Summer Rising program), we help children from under-resourced schools discover their own potential through tutoring, science enrichment, counseling, performing arts, sports, and more. Our robust team of social workers ensures that social-emotional learning concepts are present in all aspects of our work and that participants have access to individualized care and attention when needed. Our Community School Directors play a critical role in bringing a wealth of resources and opportunities directly to families, and our Program Directors rely on local talent to create a student-centered, experiential learning environment where students realize that the sky is their only limit.

We work to enrich our students' lives in partnership with PS 64, PS 142, PS/MS 140, TSMS, and PS/MS 188, the NYC Department of Youth & Community Development (DYCD), NYC Office of Community Schools (OCS), New York Cares (NYCares), The Boys and Girls Clubs of America (BGCA), and of course, our incredible local school communities.



LEARN MORE ABOUT: OUR AFTERSCHOOL SPORTS ENRICHMENT

Earlier this year, a group of public school students who are in Educational Alliance's afterschool programs throughout Lower Manhattan came together to play in their soccer league's very first tournament.

To these students — who don't have easy access to sports, arts, and other enrichment programs — a soccer tournament means a lot. Soccer doesn't just teach kids how to kick a ball or score a goal. It opens their eyes to the value of teamwork, teaching them how to work together, and empowering them with confidence in the process.
